From a recent edition of the Daily Telegraph.

Australia is to build a small fleet of fast, British-designed, German-powered patrol boats to watch over its 217,000 mile coastline. The announcement was yesterday in Canberra.

They will start arriving late in 1978 to assist in efforts towards a planned international maritime economic zone around the country. Mr. Killen, Defence Minister, said The cost of the fleet of 20 British-designed FCG 420 patrol craft is estimated at £10 million -
